Nikos Salakas is appointed Chief of Corporate Center and General Counsel

Alpha Bank, in order to enhance its Management Team for the purposes of implementing its strategic priorities, announces that as of April 1, 2024 Nikos Salakas returns to the Executive Committee, in which he served as a Member from 2019 to 2022, and is also appointed Chief of Corporate Center and General Counsel, reporting to the CEO. Nikos Salakas will be responsible for the areas of Strategy, Corporate Governance and Sustainability, Communications and Corporate Affairs and Legal Services, as well as Human Resources, working closely with the Chief Human Resources Officer, Fragiski Melissa, who will directly report to the CEO in relation to strategic issues on business culture and the Employees' development. Moreover, Nikos Salakas will be responsible for the administrative supervision of Compliance.

In March 2019, he joined Alpha Bank as Chief Legal and Governance Officer, after having worked for 20 years at Koutalidis Law Firm, where he was Head of the Banking and Finance Department. In 2022, Nikos Salakas returned to Koutalidis Law Firm, while maintaining his role as Special Legal Advisor to the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee of the Bank, thus contributing to the implementation of critical transactions.

Nikos Salakas has been recognized as a top Greek lawyer by the International Financial Law Review (IFLR), Legal 500 and Chambers and Partners.
